We are actively exploring ways to offer both immediate and long-term relief, ensuring that no one faces these challenges alone.

Our next mission trip is scheduled for April 2026.




DID YOU KNOW?

WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA



In late 2024, Hurricane Helene devastated the Spruce Pine area of North Carolina, bringing more than 15 inches of rain and causing widespread flooding, property damage, and heartbreaking loss of life. In response, Starve Poverty partnered with Central Baptist Church and Little Switzerland Disaster Relief to provide immediate aid to those affected by the hurricane.

Thanks to the swift and generous support of our donor community, we were able to deliver a trailer load of relief supplies to the region in late June 2025.

Your kindness made this possible, and we are deeply grateful for the quick action that helped make this relief effort a reality.

But our work isn't finished yet. We are planning a work trip to assist with home repairs for some of the victims. If you are able to join us, we encourage you to stay tuned to our social media channels for more details and sign-up information.

SPI BECOMES A PRODUCE HUB

FULFILL FOOD BANK

tionally been a rare sight. With only one delivery a month from Fulfill (the Food Bank), pantry patrons often go without fresh fruits and vegetables for much of the month. While certain long-lasting items like potatoes and carrots can stretch a bit further, many families have limited access to fresh produce in their diets. Larger food pantries, such as the one at SPI travel to Fulfill in Neptune, NJ for a food pickup on the weeks that Fulfill does not deliver.

In response to this challenge, Fulfill has launched a pilot program to create a Produce Hub at our SPI facility. By positioning us as a midpoint between deliveries, Fulfill is now sending a truck to SPI on the weeks they do not deliver directly. Local food pantries are then able to pick up fresh produce at our location and take it back to their communities.

This has been a game-changer for the smaller pantries, allowing them to offer fresher, healthier options to their patrons. We're thrilled to report that the program is working so well that Fulfill has extended it for another three months!

An added benefit has been the opportunity to collaborate more closely with the other food pantries in our area. We've been able to share ideas, explore new ways to work together, and strengthen our collective impact.

We are grateful for the opportunity to serve as a hub for positive change and look forward to continuing to support our community with fresh, nutritious food.



DID YOU KNOW?

Food insecurity may not consistently dominate the headlines, but it remains a deeply felt concern and growing challenge across the country.

An estimated 47 million people, including 14 million children, live in food-insecure households —the highest numbers since 2014

Approximately 13.5% of U.S. households—about 18 million households—experienced food insecurity at some point during the last couple of years.
